**Our four classes of membership are:-**

**£20 annual individual membership**

2008 Full membership with voting rights for any woman who supports the aims of the organisation.

**£5 annual individual membership (low rate)**

2008 for unwaged or low waged women – with voting rights

**£30 Group Associate membership**

For organisations who wish to support the work of WLGS, including constituency level organisations of political parties, women's organisations, political groups on councils, or national bodies. There is no voting entitlement with associate membership, and no need to show full support for our aims. Associate members will receive email newsletter updates and a chance to participate in activities.

**£10 Individual Associate membership**

For individuals who wish to support the work of WLGS, but do not want, or are unable to participate as a voting member, including males. Associate members will receive email newsletter updates.
